UP4C Report has been published!

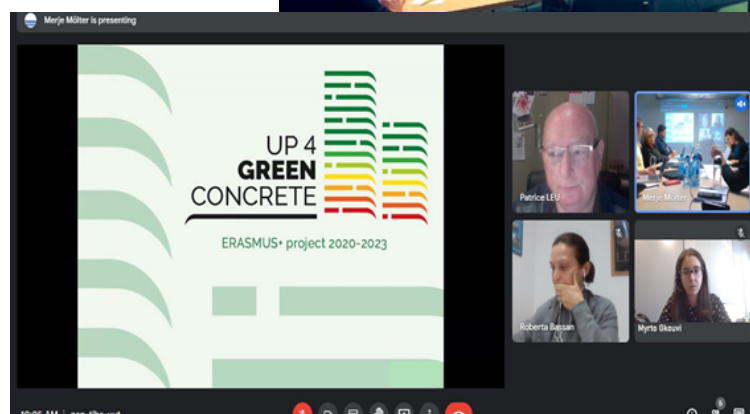
You can read the full report, translated in all the partnership languages, English, French, Greek, Italian and Polish.
